Dear Master Clemons,

I know my skills as a painter will carry us forward in the new colony. I made a good living in England, I can do so again in the New World! New opportunities will avail themselves to us. Maybe I shall serve on community committees, be a constable, or even be a fenceviewer. Serving God's needs, our family will survive and prosper. I am sure of it! And, of course I am sure thoust knows, God helps those whom help themselves.

But then again, thy being from the future, thou already knows what happens to us. Do we make good choices? Do our children prosper? Do we find peace? It would seem only reasonable that we must survive, otherwise, thou would not exist. True? And, while I would be relieved to know how things turn out for my immediate family, if God wants me to know, He will tell me.....not thou Master Clemons. The mystery of life is God's domain.

In conclusion, I hope thy question has been answered satisfactorily. I am available for thy future inquiry.

God's blessings to our family. And, for our family, be assured that I will do my best to set a firm foundation of pious faith.
